Oakham & Barleythorpe beat

One of the priorities for the team is to deal with drug dealing in and around Oakham – particularly the open spaces, parks, alleyways and private addresses. Officers and PCSO's have been patrolling these areas. Officers work in conjunction with the Rutland County Council and with support from our response officers who patrol 24/7. PC Robinson would like to reassure residents that the issue is not widespread across Oakham but limited to small areas within the town. The Rutland north team have been consulting with the residents of Rutland north and farm equipment theft is recognised as a high priority for many of our residents. Op Vitality is a police operation set up to help reduce rural criminality. Officers provide a visible presence during the hours of darkness to the rural community. Active stop checks are being completed on vehicles moving in the area between the hours of 21:00 – 06:00.

Rural crime is a key concern for residents living in this area. A number of issues have been highlighted: theft of farm equipment, Landrover Defenders, poaching and hare coursing are areas of concern. As with our other rural beats we are running Op Vitality which allows us to target the criminals who travel into Rutland to commit rural crime. Officers on Rutland south will always try and visit victims of rural crime to offer reassurance and further crime prevention advice. The officers are members of several rurally orientated WhatsApp groups, enabling them to be informed of what is happening in the rural community.

The officers rely on information from the community. If you see anything suspicious please report it to us.
