Crimes of Note: June 2023

BURGLARY

21st – Barrowden – re patio door forced - alarm activated so no entry gained.

ASSAULT

3rd – Braunston in Rutland - Threats to harm victim

14th Braunston in Rutland – Public Order / common assault

17th - Ketton - common Assault

19th – Wing Harassment

21st – Ketton – male assaulted - one person arrested and bailed.

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

10th Ketton – damage to lock to building site entrance. Entry gained although nothing stolen.

In Summary

The main threat this month has been assaults with 2 in Braunston and 2 in Ketton. All assaults are investigated and we do look for positive outcomes where we have a known suspect.

We have had one residential break this month in Barrowden, fortunately the alarm activated and the perpetrators did not gain entry. I'm pleased to say we have had no reports of breaks to rural farms and outbuilding in June but rural locations including building sites and Farms are often targeted as their plant equipment are highly desired commodities due to demand exceeding worldwide supply. We are running operation Vitality for rural crime with extra officers out patrolling. Please remain vigilant, insure doors and windows are always locked and leave lights on if you go out.

If you see witness or suspect anything similar happening, please call the police. Your call may be all that's required to catch them in the act!

The Community Speed Watch is now up and running and Caldecott commenced there 2 weeks monitoring from $12^{th} - 25^{th}$ June. Edith Weston are out presently monitoring from $3^{rd} - 16^{th}$ July. Officers will still be out with the speed gun monitoring motorists. if you are caught expect your vehicle to be stopped at the roadside and the driver reported for the offence of Exceeding the Speed limit.

Speeding is one of the "Fatal 4" causes of death during a collision.

- 1. Driver distractions (mobile phones etc.)
- 2. Inappropriate speed.
- 3. Lack of seatbelt.
- 4. Alcohol or drug Impairment.
